Campers will learn about music, rhythm, creative teamwork and environmental citizenship - all under the leadership of Donald Knaack, "The Junkman."

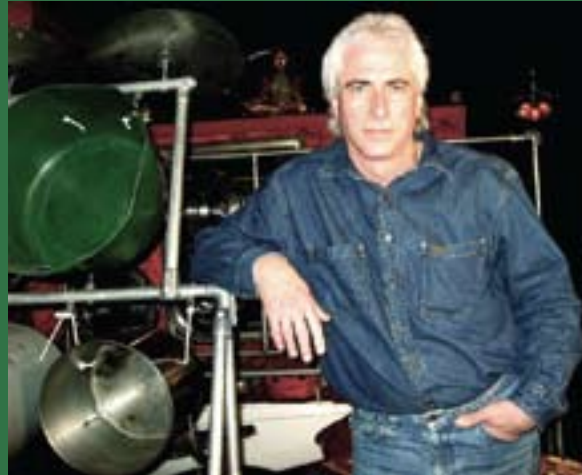

Donald Knaack (aka The Junkman) travels to the beat of a different drummer. A conservatory-trained percussionist, he has been a member of the Louisville Orchestra and the Buffalo Philharmonic and a studio percussionist and drummer in the studios of Hollywood. He now exclusively composes for and performs on junk and recycled materials. It's called Junk Music and it's a unique collection of infectious grooves and musical styles that's gaining audiences from every spectrum of the music business. Impossible to categorize, worldwide audiences are recognizing Junk Music as eye-opening, provocative and entirely new.

The Junkman also constructs "Junk Music Playstations" which are sound sculptures made exclusively from recycled materials in which large numbers of persons can simultaneously have a "Junkjam." The Playstations are constructed for schools, festivals and museums.
